PUEBLO DEL MAR

- Value of Goods and Services donated: \$113,324
- ◆ 100% of the parents at Pueblo del Mar regained custody and were reunited with their children.
- Young philanthropist, Sara Dubois (11yrs) donated \$502.49 to Pueblo del Mar's Family Recovery Community this past summer. Sara commented that she just wanted to help others. "I know that many people don't have as much as I do."





MEN'S RESIDENTIAL

- Men's Residential Scholarship Fund −\$38,940
- Total completion rates for the Men's Residential Program for the last five years averaged slightly more than 62%, well above the national norm of 38%!





PREVENTION

- Approximately 500 students and 130 parents were mentored through our evidence-based Life Skills Training classes.
- Thanks to our prevention work throughout Monterey County, alcohol and other drug related in-patient hospitalizations for youth have decreased from 95 in 100,000 to 10 in 100,000 youth.
- Additionally, every year we give Gateway Drug presentations to over 1,000 individuals in over 30 schools in Monterey County. Keep up the good work!


