





PUEBLO DEL MAR

The Family Recovery Program at Pueblo del Mar offers comprehensive wraparound services for families in early recovery from drug or alcohol through targeted case management, relapse prevention classes, individual and group counseling, as well as weekly AA/NA meetings, job development and cooperative childcare.

We proudly served 173 clients in our Pueblo del Mar program.

73% successfully completed the program.



61% served are children

21 families 48 children were reunified!

22% served are female parents 17% served are male parents



OUTPATIENT RECOVERY SERVICES

Outpatient Recovery Services offer a variety of individual and group therapy styles for individuals and families empowering them to stop the cycle of addiction and take charge of their lives. While most of our counseling services are focused on assisting individuals with substance abuse problems, our services also include other forms of counseling such as family or couples counseling.

We proudly served 321 clients in our Outpatient program. 88% of clients reported that they would recommend Outpatient program to family and friends in need. 96% of clients reported that their rights were honored by Outpatient staff. 100% of clients reported that they were treated with dignity and respect.








DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

AVERAGE DUI CLIENT




- 92% of clients indicated that they had 'almost always or usually' learned useful information.
- 96% of clients surveyed reported that they were always treated with dignity and respect during their involvement with Sun Street Centers.
- 97% of clients surveyed reported that the overall evaluation of the program was very good to excellent.

Two audits were performed which produced only 3 deficiencies.

(45 deficiencies are allowed per site in Monterey County). A deficiency is when county or state auditors find a protocol or process out of compliance.






MEN'S RESIDENTIAL

Our CARF-accredited, state-licensed recovery program provides a supportive environment for men seeking a life free from the devastating effects of drug and alcohol addiction. Certified counselors and recovery participants incorporate the principles of Social Model recovery, which utilize a peer-oriented, mutual help system that views the participant as a student, not a patient. Residents attend 12-step meetings, get a sponsor, take personal responsibility for their own recovery and learn about the disease of addiction through evidence based Matrix curriculum.

We proudly served 321 clients in our Men's Residential program.

158 men successfully completed the program.



SOBERING CENTER

The Sobering Center is the first program of its kind in Monterey County. It functions as an alternative to a jail stay in the event of a non-violent intoxicated individual who has been arrested for driving under the influence or intoxicated in public.





Diversion Criteria

Eligibility Requirements:

- Ages 18+
- Non-combative and agreeable
- Have a measurable BAC
- Be verbally responsive, able to communicate
- No severe medical conditions
- Referrals from Law Enforcement only (no self-referrals / walk-ins)

We proudly served 254 clients in our Sobering Center program for public intoxication and DUI, reducing the risk of harm to the community.

94% of clients reported that they were often treated with dignity, respect and the staff

97% of clients reported that the overall evaluation of the so Sobering Center was very good to excellent.

100% of clients reported that the site was clean and comfortable.

PREVENTION | PENINSULA

Dedicated to building healthy and safe communities, the Prevention Centers provide a variety of services to community members and their families, in order to build awareness and promote action toward resolving community health problems relating to drug and alcohol abuse. Programs and services vary at each center.

We proudly served 4,650 people in our Peninsula Prevention program.

96% of people served in Peninsula Prevention were ages 0-17 years old.

Peninsula Prevention partnered up with Dual Language Academy of the Monterey Peninsula to present anti-bullying campaign, Pink Shirt Day, to students.

87% of students in our Life Skills Training program reported they don't drink or use at all now after being asked how the Life Skills Training has changed the amount of drugs and alcohol they use.





183 students were served through our Gateway Drug presentation.



PREVENTION | ROAD TO SUCCESS

The Road to Success is pre-diversion program for youth, first time offenders of crimes. Diversion plans are developed in collaboration with the student, their parents and a case management specialist with the goal of offering a path to success through education, community involvement, Life Skills Training, counseling and employment.

We proudly served 69 youth in our Road to Success Youth Pre-Diversion program with 47 successfully completing the program.



- 75% of youth graduates reported that the overall evaluation of the program was very good to excellent.
- 97% of youth graduates reported they agree to strongly agree that the program is helpful.
- 94% of youth graduates reported that the services helped improve relations with family and friends.





Early Intervention

- Assessment of individual needs, warm referrals to outside agencies, individual counseling, & recreational activities with incentives
- Evidence-based training that addresses youth drug abuse & co-occurring psychological, situational & life skills deficits
- Close communication with school regarding attendance & grades.

Parent Satisfaction Questionnaire

- 94% of parents noticed an improvement in their child's attitude or behavior.
- 100% of parents agreed that the program was beneficial to them and their family.
- 100% of parents would recommend the Road to Success program to others.
