For our second quarter, we had the pleasure of working with and presenting to **843 youth/adults** through our educational presentations. **Collaboration** is the key component to helping get our message to youth, adults, and families. Special thanks to Notre Dame High School, Salinas High School, Rancho Cielo Youth Campus, Marina High School, Seaside High School, International School of Monterey, Community Human Services, Colton Middle School, Monterey High School, One Stop Career Center, Monterey Rape Crisis Center and Juvenile Hall.

In addition, South County Prevention Staff worked with South County districts to provide presentations about 'Prescription Drugs and Narcan' with a live testimony to over **400 high school students**. This gave students insight into the role Narcan plays in an opioid overdose followed by a 'questions and answer' session.

## ROAD TO SUCCESS: PRE-DIVERSION PROGRAM

**Road to Success** is a pre-diversion program for youth, first time offenders of crimes. This 3 to 6-month program seeks to prevent school expulsion and/or entry into the juvenile justice system by offering youth offenders individualized diversion plans that include substance abuse intervention and education, participation in pro-social activities, individual and/or family counseling, parent workshops, and community service hours.


