We have just completed a very busy and successful year at Sun Street Centers. I could not be prouder of the accomplishments of our clients who are doing the work to achieve a healthier life. In these pages you will see data to match my enthusiasm. Our amazing staff create and update goals every year, Sergot Consulting helps us track and capture data on each goal, and now we present the results to you, our community!

Some highlights and trends I want to point out – Our staff of 176 professionals served 12,142 people in three counties last fiscal year! We did it with the help of 361 collaborating organizations. As we focused a great deal of attention on opioid and Fentanyl education, trends for methamphetamines and other stimulant use are on the rise. Opioid misuse dropped down to third place as stimulant use tied with alcohol for primary drug misused upon entering treatment. Client satisfaction surveys were very high in perceived improvements in mental and physical

health and quality of services received. Program completions also have increased over the past two years. The best chance of success is taking advantage of our services as long as possible to achieve effective outcomes. The fact that most clients indicate high level of satisfaction with our services is gratifying. And when we see, or are shown, the need to improve, our teams work diligently to improve.

I want to thank our amazing Board Members who have created a strategic plan for our communities and are stewards of all the funds and governance supporting Sun Street Centers. You will see comments from our alumni throughout and future growth highlighted on our back page. Thank you for being our partner in responding to the disease of addiction.

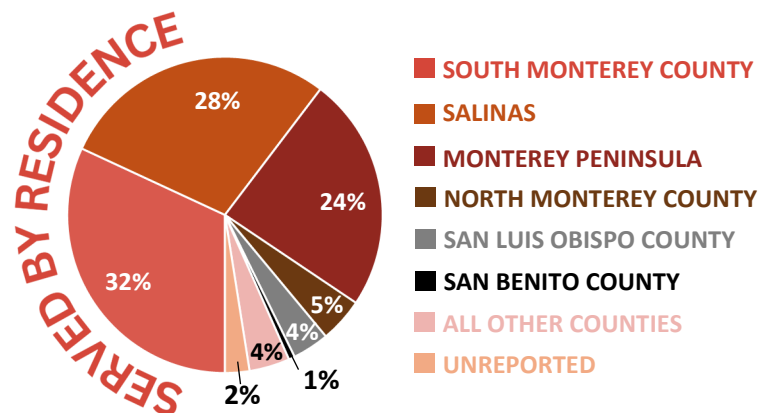
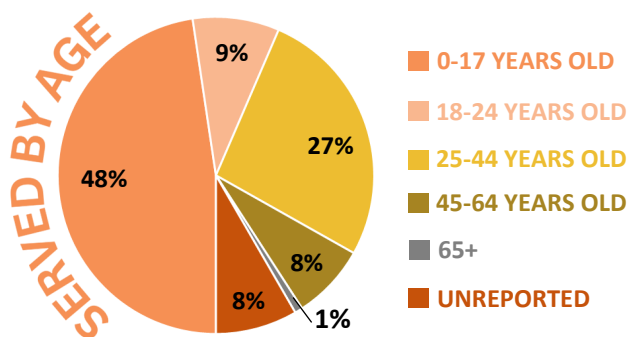
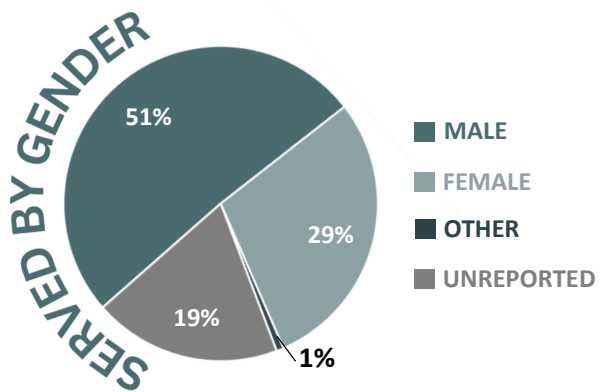
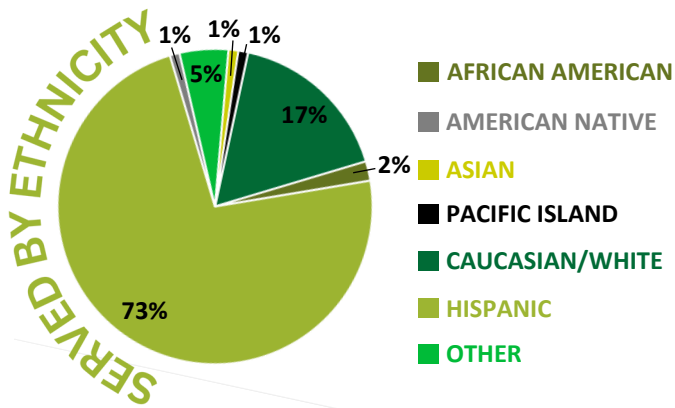
Since 1968, Sun Street Centers has been providing the most comprehensive and effective services for education, prevention and recovery of alcohol and drug use disorder. Relying on a proven social model developed by our founders, Martin and Nancy Dodd, as well as the compassion and experience of our staff, we welcome all individuals and families to hope, heal, share and thrive with a drug-free and alcohol-free lifestyle.



In the 2023-2024 fiscal year (FY), Sun Street Centers proudly served **12,142 clients**, an increase of 797 clients compared to FY 2022-2023. **60%** were served in **Prevention Programs**, **30%** were served in **Intervention Programs**, **10%** were served in **Treatment and Recovery Programs**,

The largest number of clients served based on those reporting **ethnicity** was **73% of clients** identifying as **Hispanic**, **17%** as **Caucasian/White**, **2%** as **African American**, **1%** as **American Indian**, **1%** as **Asian**, **1%** as **Pacific Island**, and **5%** as **Other** (excludes prevention services). **1,832 clients** reported as **monolingual Spanish-speakers**. **Upon entry, 235 clients** in treatment reported they were **unhoused**.

We proudly served a total of **216 veterans!**



Each year, Sun Street Centers counts the number of inter-agency collaborations as a requirement for one of its funding sources. Through these cooperative activities, Sun Street Centers not only shares its resources and expertise with other agencies, it also receives comparable, low-cost/high quality support from them and, thereby, expands its ability to serve our clients.

This past year, we were part of **361 collaborations**. A total of **17,624 volunteer hours** were donated to community action activities, **1,268 volunteer hours** were donated to agency activities, and our board completed **870 volunteer hours**.

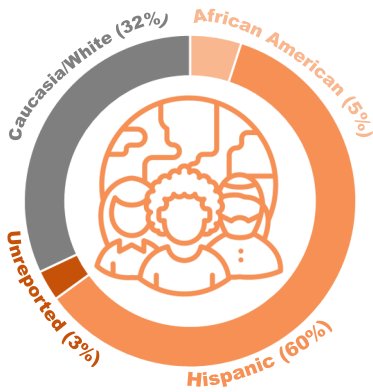

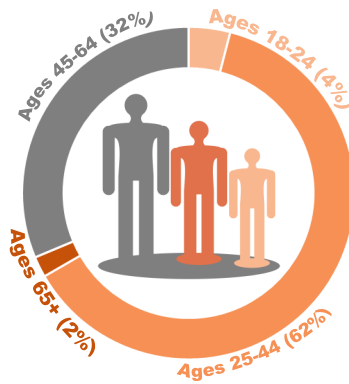

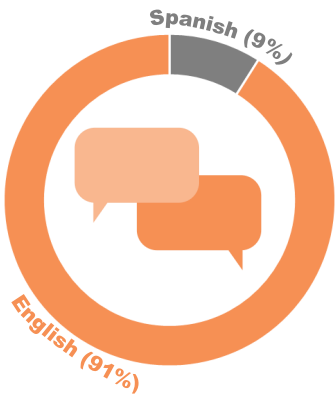

The Salinas Men's Residential program proudly served a total of **343 clients** with an **84% completion rate**. The clients served in this program come from various regions within Monterey County and neighboring cities. **25%** of total residents served reside in **Salinas**, **6%** in **North Monterey County**, **6%** in **South Monterey County**, **5%** on the **Monterey Peninsula**, **5%** in **San Luis Obispo County**, **4%** in **San Benito County**, **1%** from neighboring cities, and **48%** were **unhooused**.

This state-licensed recovery program offers a nurturing environment for men aiming to break free from the harmful impacts of drug and alcohol use disorder. With certified counselors guiding them, participants engage in the Social Model of recovery, which promotes a peer-oriented, mutual support system that views them as students rather than patients.

Program residents participated in community events and completed a total of **2,017 volunteer hours**, as 'giving back' to the community is a vital part of the recovery experience.

The Hollister Women's Residential and Perinatal program proudly served a total of **86 clients** with a **58% completion rate**. The clients served in this program come from various regions within Monterey County and neighboring cities. **47%** of total clients served reside in **San Benito County**, **41%** in **San Luis Obispo County**, and **12%** in **Monterey County**.

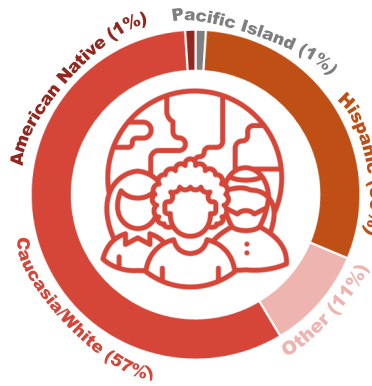
This state-licensed recovery program located in Downtown Hollister provides a supportive environment for single women and women with small children seeking a life free from the devastating effects of drug and alcohol use disorder. Certified counselors and recovery participants incorporate the principles of Social Model recovery, which utilize a peer-oriented, mutual help system that views the participant as a student, not a patient.

Program residents participated in community events and completed a total of **42 volunteer hours**, as 'giving back' to the community is a vital part of the recovery experience.

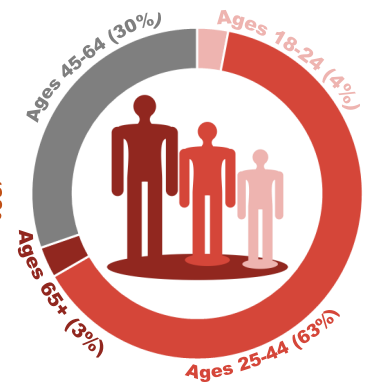

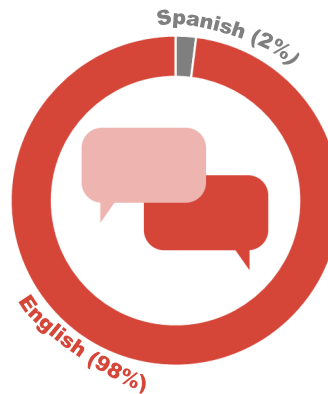

The King City Men's & Women's Residential Program, located in downtown, proudly served a total of **138 clients** with a **67% completion rate** between both programs. The clients served in this program come from various regions within Monterey County and neighboring cities. **22%** of total clients served reside in **Salinas**, **18%** in **South Monterey County**, **18%** in **San Luis Obispo (SLO)**, **12%** on the **Monterey Peninsula**, **2%** in neighboring cities, **1%** in **North Monterey County** and **27%** were **unhoused**.

Our state-licensed recovery programs provide a supportive environment for men and women who are seeking freedom from the devastating effects of drug and alcohol use disorder. Residents attend evidenced-based classes, 12-step meetings, get a sponsor, and take personal responsibility for their own recovery.

The San Luis Obispo (SLO) Men's Residential program proudly served a total of **98 clients** with a **66% completion rate**. The clients served in this program come from various regions within San Luis Obispo County and neighboring cities. **100%** of total clients served reside in **San Luis Obispo County (SLO)** and **18%** were **unhoused**. **63%** of total clients identify as **Caucasian/White**, **31%** as **Hispanic**, **2%** as **African American**, **2%** as other, **1%** as **American Indian**, and **1%** as **Asian**.

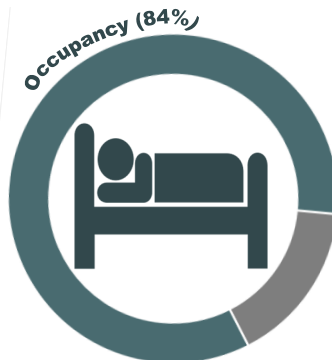
This state-licensed recovery program provides a supportive environment for individuals seeking a life free from the devastating effects of drug and alcohol use disorder. Certified counselors and recovery participants incorporate the principles of Social Model recovery, which utilize a peer-oriented, mutual help system that views the participant as a student, not a patient.

Participants in the SLO Residential Program engaged in **social activities**, including bowling nights at Cal Poly, providing a fun and sober environment for the men to bond. Following the outdoor field trips, **90%** of clients reported **improvements** in their **physical health**.

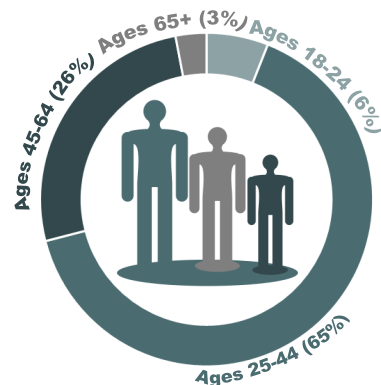

The Outpatient/Counseling services empower individuals to stop the cycle of substance use disorder and take charge of their lives. Participants are provided group and individual sessions and services in Salinas, Seaside, and King City. Core areas addressed include early recovery skills, relapse prevention, and family education.

Counseling services are available for men, women, couples, youth (ages 12-17 years old), and families.

Throughout Monterey County, the Outpatient program served a total of **463 clients** with **47%** of them residing in the **Salinas area**. **84%** of clients were **male** and **16%** were **female**. **76%** of total clients served identify as **Hispanic**.

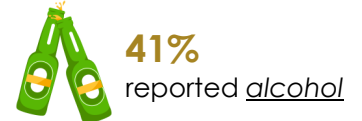

Sun Street Centers' Sober Living Environments (SLE) in Salinas, Hollister and King City are committed to ensuring a safe, clean, structured recovery environment, and dedicated to providing a supportive and affordable sober living. Residents agree to a Sober Living Covenant designed to develop character, self-esteem, responsibility, self-reliance, and accountability in order to help in the process of rebuilding a life.

Throughout Monterey County, the SLE program served a total of **87 clients**. **53%** of clients served were **male** and **47%** were **female**. A total of **63%** of clients are **ages 25-45**, **30%** are **46-64**, **5%** are over **65**, and **2%** are **18-24**.

The DUI Education Program is licensed by the State of California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), Substance Use Disorder Compliance Division, Driving Under the Influence Unit, to provide quality education and counseling to help the participant understand his/her relationship with alcohol and drugs, and the inherent risk of driving while under the influence. First and multiple offender services are available.

Throughout Monterey County, the DUI program served a total of **3,243 clients** with **43%** of them residing in the **Salinas area**. A total of **82%** of clients served were **male**, **63%** were **ages 25-45**, and **75%** identified as **Hispanic**.

The Sobering Center, located in Salinas, CA, provides a safe alternative for non-violent offenders to avoid jail and receive the care they need, to begin their sobriety on the right foot. Law enforcement agencies will refer individuals that are publicly intoxicated or driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs.

This program proudly served a total of **244 clients** with **99%** of clients accepting referrals to other needed services. The clients served in this program come from various regions within Monterey County and neighboring cities. **47%** of total clients served reside in **Salinas**, **22%** on the **Monterey Peninsula**, **18%** in neighboring cities, **8%** in **South Monterey County**, **3%** in **North Monterey County**, and **2%** in **San Benito County**.

**68%** of total clients identify as **Hispanic**, **22%** as **Other**, **4%** as **Caucasian/White**, **3%** as African American, **2%** as **Asian**, and **1%** as **American Indian**.

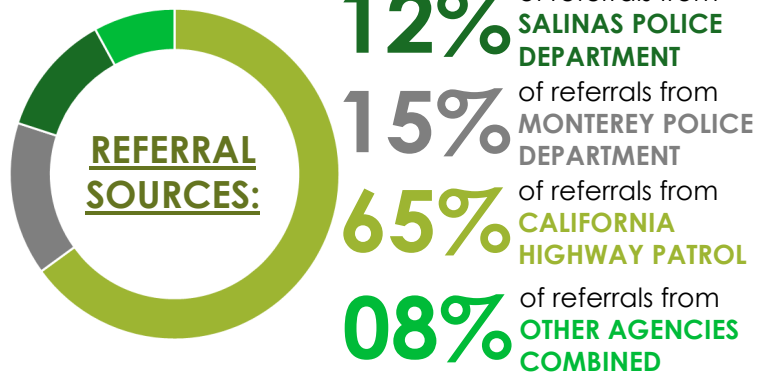
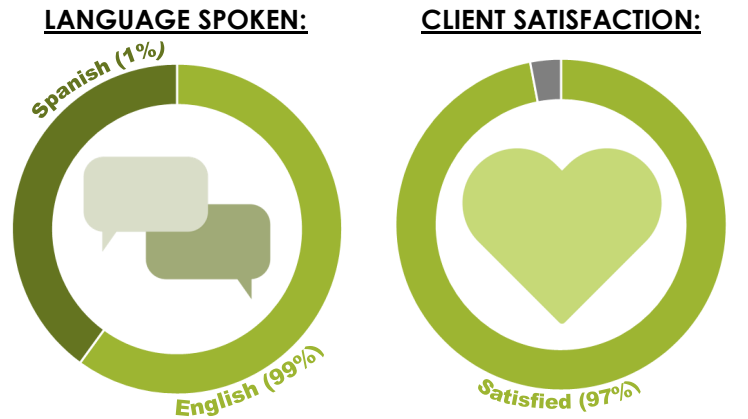
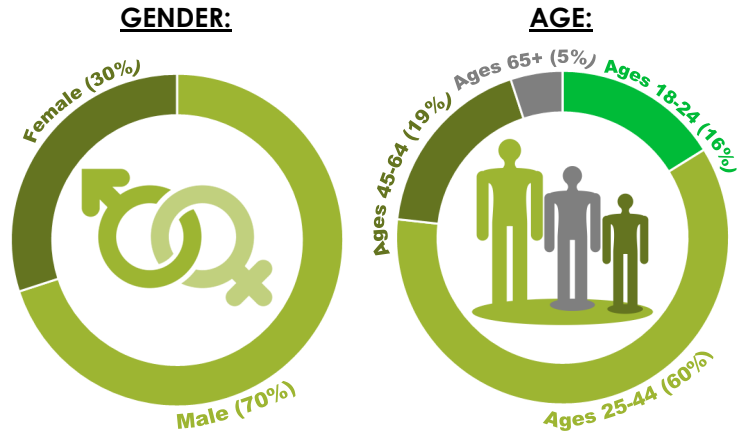

This 3 to 6-month program seeks to prevent school expulsion and/or entry into the juvenile justice system by offering youth offenders individualized diversion plans that include substance abuse intervention and education, participation in pro-social activities, individual and/or family counseling, parent workshops, and community service hours. Diversion plans are developed in collaboration with the student, their parents and a case management specialist with the goal of offering a path to success through education, employment, community involvement, Life Skills Training and counseling.

The Road to Success program in South Monterey County proudly served a total of **96 youth** with a **67% program completion rate** and **0% recidivism rate**. A total of **7 Community Accountability Board (CAB) Meetings** took place in Gonzales, Soledad, Greenfield, and King City. Youth program participants completed a total of **1,150 community volunteer hours** and **1,858 hours of pro-social activities**.

The best part of the CAB Meetings is getting to listen to the youth talk about the underlying issues that lead up to finding themselves in that situation... It is also an opportunity for them to get feedback, and get some direction, and even get some help for them to start changing the behavior and making a better path for them going forward.

In the Monterey Peninsula, the Road to Success program proudly served a total of **27 youth** with a **94% program completion rate** and **0% recidivism rate**. A total of **2 Community Accountability Board (CAB) Meetings** took place in the City of Seaside. Youth program participants completed a total of **340 community volunteer hours** and **327 hours of pro-social activities**.

The Prevention Department proudly served a total of **7,317 people** throughout Monterey County with **77%** of them being **ages 0-17 years old**. **39%** of total people served reside in **South Monterey County**, **27%** on the **Monterey Peninsula**, **21%** in **Salinas**, **5%** in **North Monterey County**, **1%** in **San Benito County**, and **7%** in neighboring cities.

In **April 2024**, the Prevention Department joined forces with local law enforcement agencies to host a **Narcan Drive-Thru** in three cities across South Monterey County, responding to the rise in drug-related overdoses. (pictured below: Prevention Coordinator with Soledad Police Department)

The Salinas Prevention Department proudly served a total of **1,503 people**. **453 people** served identify as **male**, **406** identify as **female**, **1** reported as **other** and **643** went **unreported**. In terms of ages served, a total of **917** children between ages **0 to 17 years old**, **29** young adults between **18 to 24 years old**, **86** adults between **25 to 44 years old**, **31** between the ages of **45 to 64 years old**, and **440** individuals that were over the age of **65 years old** or unknown.

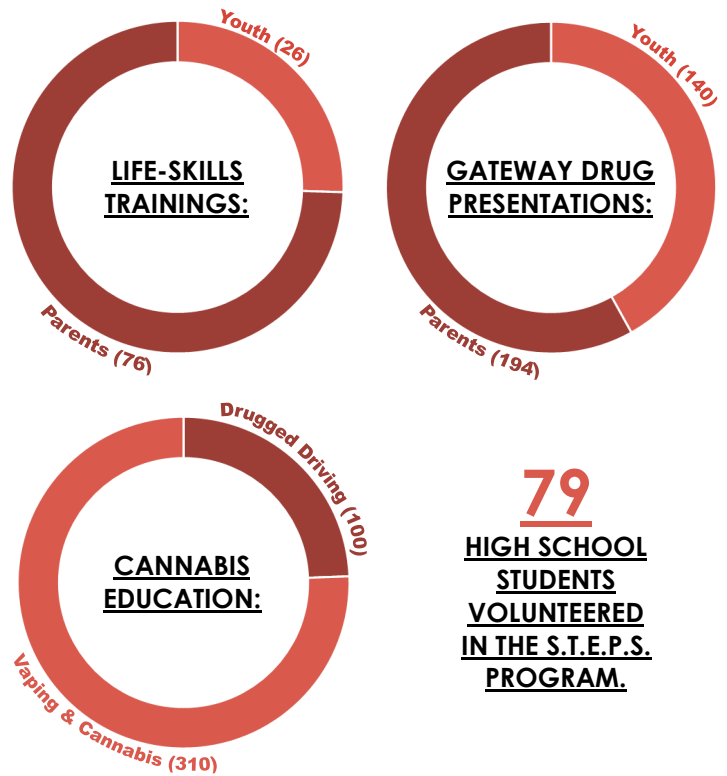
This past year, this prevention site focused on boosting parent engagement by offering various educational services, including **8 Life Skills Trainings** and **19 Gateway Drug presentations**, reaching a total of **270 parents** and adults. These initiatives were designed to empower parents with knowledge and tools to support their children's development and well-being.

In collaboration with the **Frank Paul Family Resource Center (FPFRC)**, we successfully reestablished our **Parents Creating Solutions** group. Parents gathered weekly to gain insights into the risks linked to teen substance use and discover how they can nurture their children's growth. Thanks to this remarkable partnership with FPFRC, we organized a **Community Forum** (pictured below) to discuss local drug trends affecting teenagers. Additionally, various organizations were present to provide information about their services to the families attending the forum.

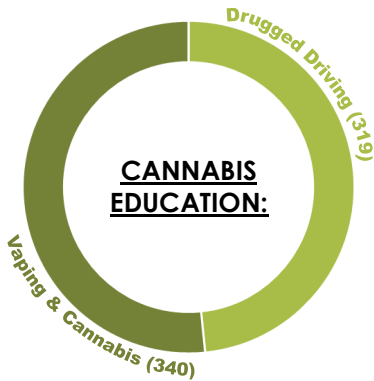
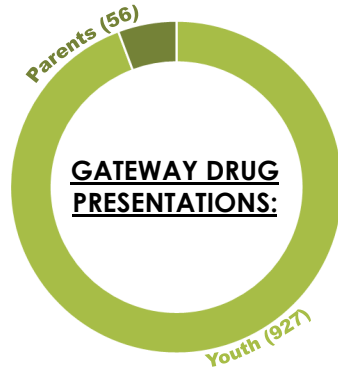
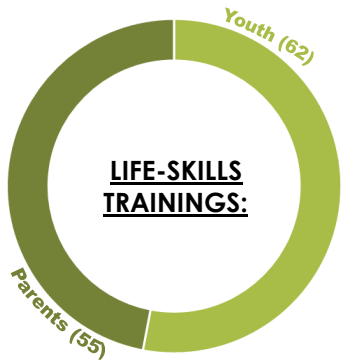

The Monterey Peninsula Prevention Program proudly served a total of **3,019 people**. **1,215 people** served identify as **male**, **1,327** identify as **female**, **31** reported as **other**, and **446** went **unreported**. In terms of ages served, a total of **2,675** children between ages **0 to 17 years old**, **119** young adults between **18 to 24 years old**, **136** adults between **25 to 44 years old**, **9** between the ages of **45 to 64 years old**, and **80** individuals that were over the age of **65 years old** or **unknown**.

Over the last year, the program aimed to broaden its services to **North Monterey County**, reaching a total of **356 residents** in the area. Given that this region lacks sufficient community resources, it was an excellent opportunity to disseminate information and provide available services to families.

Additionally, the team has been enhancing collaboration with local colleges such as **California State University Monterey Bay (CSUMB)** and **Monterey Peninsula College (MPC)**. Most students at these institutions are of legal drinking and smoking age, which makes them more susceptible to the dangers linked to irresponsible drinking or drug use. To address these concerns, the team has initiated educational presentations and outreach programs aimed at promoting responsible behavior. Through these efforts, the team hopes to create a healthier and more aware student body, empowering them to thrive both academically and personally.

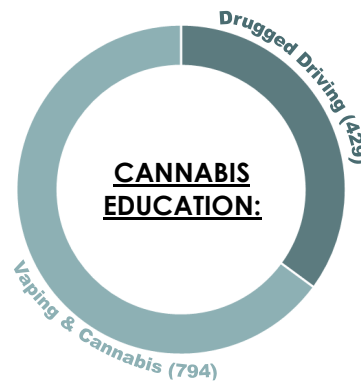
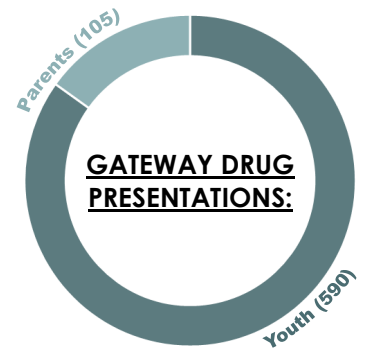
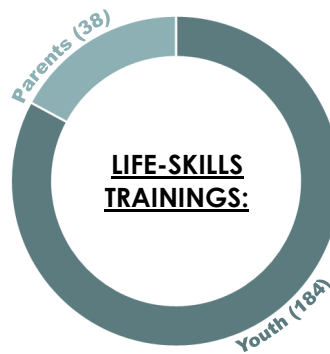


The South Monterey County Prevention Department proudly served a total of **2,795 people**. **679** served identify as **male** and **847** identify as **female**, and **1,269** went **unreported**. In terms of ages served, the South Monterey County Prevention Program served a total of **2,144** children between age **0 to 17 years old**, **129** young adults between **18 to 24 years old**, **17** adults between **25 to 44 years old**, **8** between the ages of **45 to 64 years old**, and **497** individuals that were over the age of **65 years old** or unknown.

This site set ambitious goals for **Life Skills Training (LST)** aimed at youth. They served **184 teens** through the LST program, which accounted for **68%** of the total youth served through this program by the Prevention Department as a whole. The majority of participants reported gaining insights into the causes and effects of drug use on the body, effective anger management techniques, and other essential life skills.

A significant highlight for the South County Prevention Department is the remarkable youth engagement in the **Safe Teens Empowerment Project (STEPS)** (pictured below), particularly from the **City of Soledad**. South Monterey County boasted a total of **207 STEPS Student Youth Leaders**, accounting for **70%** of all STEPS Student Youth Leaders from various sites across Monterey County. Specifically, **37%** of the participants from South Monterey County were from **Soledad High School**, followed by **27%** from **King City High School**, **17%** from **Pinnacles High School**, **15%** from **Portola Butler High School**, and **4%** from **Gonzales High School**.

# Coming Soon in 2024-2025



**Hope Housing at Nancy Dodd Community Center**, located in Marina, CA, is an individually tailored program designed to provide comprehensive **housing services** connected to **Substance Use Disorder (SUD)** and **Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS)**. This program is dedicated to meeting the unique mental health and substance use treatment needs of each client through a personalized, trauma informed, and flexible approach to treatment and care coordination. The Hope Housing Program offers a service-enriched Bridge Housing environment. Hope Housing is a collaborative effort involving **key partners**:



The **Building for Recovery Campaign** is nearing completion! We broke ground in March 2024 and anticipate opening our doors for services in the **summer of 2025**. The center will offer intensive, daily outpatient treatment programs for both youth and adults, provide space for recovery groups, and include a sober living facility for individuals and families. We project serving **300 individuals** annually at the **Recovery Center**, along with an additional **40 each year** in the **sober living program**. With this expansion to our current campus, we will be equipped to deliver a comprehensive range of treatment services for those seeking assistance with substance abuse.
