ONE YEAR OF HOPE AT HOPE HOUSING

It has been one year since Hope Housing opened at the Nancy Dodd Community Center in Marina. Hope Housing provides individualized support connecting residents to Substance Use Disorder (SUD) and Specialty Mental Health Services, helping them move toward permanent housing within 18 months. In our first year, we served 98 adults and 36 children, with 94% of residents rating the program as high quality.

This works is possible thanks to our partners, **Monterey County Behavioral Health, Interim Inc., Housing Resource Center, Housing Authority of Monterey County**. As well as the generous support from **Monterey County Behavioral Health** and the **Montage Grant**, which allows us to serve this underrepresented demographic.

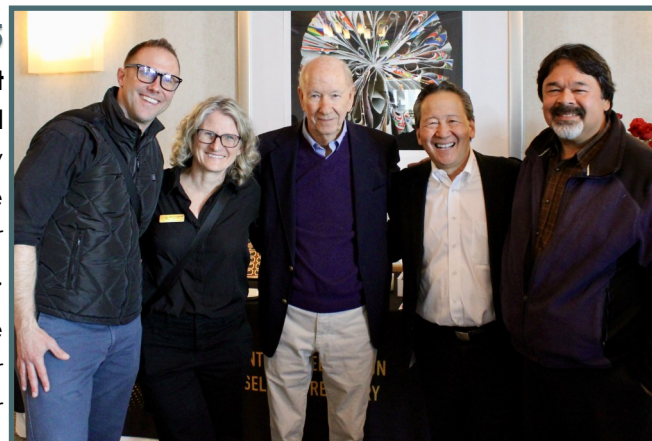
IN MEMORY OF

STRENGTHENING RECOVERY THROUGH VOLUNTEER WORK

As we celebrate 57 years of service, we continue to uphold the values of our founders, **Martin & Nancy Dodd**, including the Social Model recovery approach that treats each participant as a student, not a patient. Our residents stay involved through community events and volunteer work, as giving back is a core part of their recovery.

Last fiscal year, residents in our tri-county Residential programs completed **1,761 volunteer hours**, supporting local events like the **Salinas Rodeo, Big Sur Marathon, Relay for Life, AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am**, and **Community Food Banks** across Monterey, San Benito, and San Luis Obispo Counties.

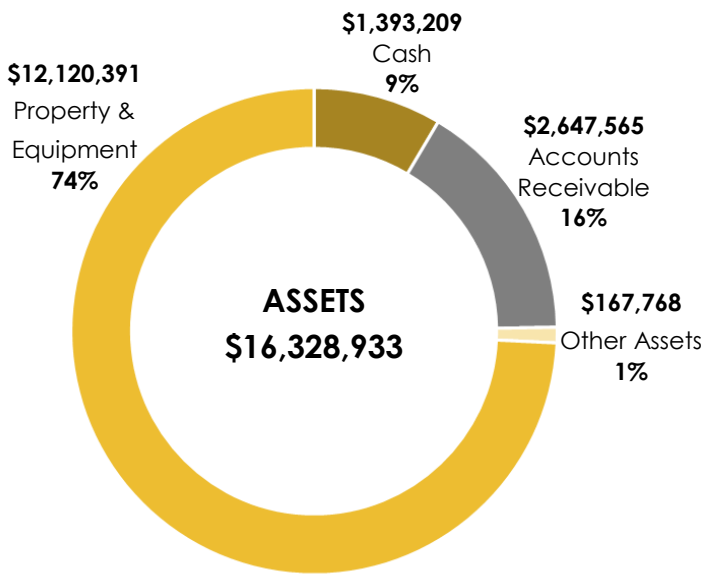

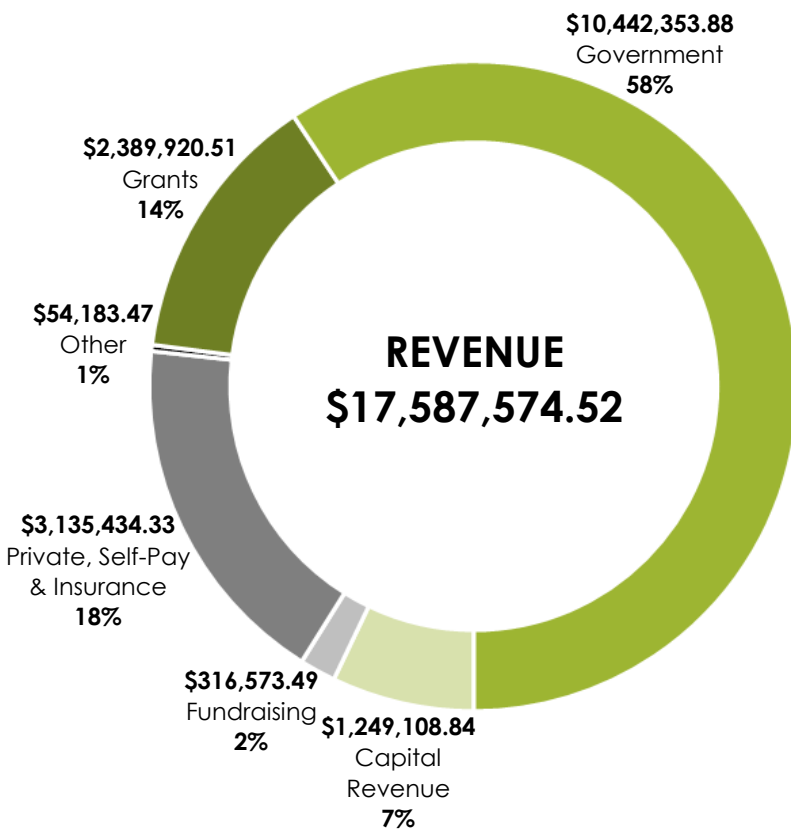

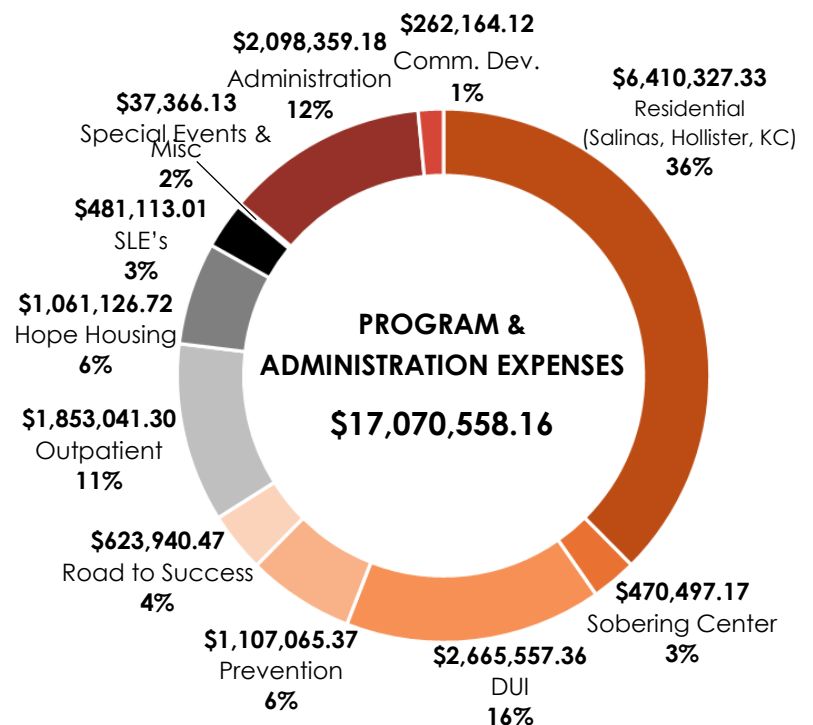

WHAT'S NEXT?

Looking ahead, Sun Street Centers is preparing to open its first local **residential treatment program** in **Seaside** for **teens**, ages 12 to 17, with substance use disorders. Funded through a **Bond BHCIP Round 1** grant awarded to **La'i Communities**, the **40-bed** program will primarily serve Medi-Cal youth from **Seaside** and **Monterey County**, with limited space for neighboring counties. Opening in **January 2027**, it will receive referrals from County Behavioral Health departments and local hospitals, finally offering families a nearby option instead of sending teens to Los Angeles County for treatment and care.
